Patient Participation Groups

What is a Patient Participation Group (PPG)?

A patient-led group, linked to a local general practice, that works alongside GPs and practice staff to provide a patient perspective on healthcare services that are offered to the community.

Some of the benefits of having a Patient Participation Group:



Build 2 way communication between staff and patients



Create an efficient service tailored to patient needs



Gain a patient perspective on local health services

Encourage patients to take responsibility for their own health

Examples of how Patient Participation Groups around Scotland are helping GP practices and patients:

- By helping to develop practice communications e.g. booklets, patient newsletter
- By helping to carry out surveys or obtain patient views
- By promoting awareness of and access to local health services
- By providing advice on the development of new or existing practice premises
- By supporting the practice in its health promotion and education work e.g. provide additional resource and support for an 'open day' or 'health fair'
